- Tom Gray has developed a field usage policy for review. Initial recommendation is to charge \$100 per hour and organizations need to sign a waiver before taking the field.
- The township is asking that we complete our schedules prior to April 1
- Insurance review
  - Graham Park building contents (concession and field maintenance) are not currently covered, just the buildings themselves
  - This is being addressed and sparked the insurance review that Pam is working on
    - One question to be addressed is exactly what do we own and what does the township own?
- Foul Ball Project
  - Township will be opening bids at their March 10 meeting
  - Anthony is submitting a grant proposal to the Pittsburgh Pirates Charity
